Ciara is the SaLT Team Lead for Phoenix School and Phoenix College. She graduated for Manchester Metropolitan University in 2009 with a BSc (Hons) in Speech Pathology and Psychology. Ciara specialises in Autism and Social communication disorders and has extensive experience working with a varied caseload that attend specialist provision and mainstream settings. Ciara is passionate about providing a SaLT service for all those that attend Phoenix school and Phoenix College. Ciara is trained in Attention Autism, PECs, SCERTS, Makaton and Dysphagia. She has experience in a range of highly specialist intervention to support a range of speech, language and communication needs



Orit Specialist Speech and Language Therapist

Orit joined Phoenix College in 2021 and works across Phoenix School 6th form and College. Her role focuses on supporting students with their transitions into adulthood. She graduated from Manchester Metropolitan University in 2016 with a BSc in Speech Pathology and Therapy and has also gained a MA in Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities from the Tizard Centre. Orit has 7 years of experience in working with children and adults with Autism and intellectual disabilities to support their communication, eating and drinking. THIS WEEK




